The uterus and the womb are two terms for the same organ often used interchangeably.

The **uterus** plays a crucial role in reproductive processes, including menstruation, pregnancy, and childbirth. During pregnancy, the uterus expands significantly to accommodate the growing fetus.

**Womb** is often used more poetically or metaphorically to refer to the uterus. It emphasises the nurturing and protective aspect of the organ, especially during pregnancy.
